

NatureSpeak Knits Beaded Edges!!

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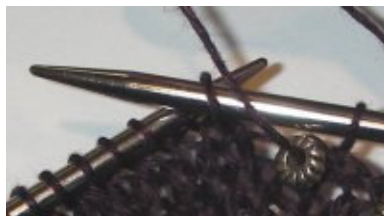
There are many different ways to add beads to knitted edges. Here are some basic beading tips:

Bound-off Edges

One option is to slip a bead onto the stitch about to be bound off just before you knit the next stitch. Then finish the bind off as usual (pass the beaded stitch over the new stitch).



This option works well when you are binding-off **purl-wise**. With the beads strung on the yarn before binding off, slip one bead up against the piece between stitches. The bead sits on the loop between two purred, bound-off stitches.



All Edges

And yet another approach is to string the desired number of beads onto the edging yarn and single crochet around the edge, slipping the bead through the final two loops as you complete the stitch.
